PRIVACY POLICY

NOLA Bank recognizes, respects, and protects the personal privacy rights of all our customers. We realize that our customers entrust us with personal information and it is our policy to maintain our customers' information in a confidential manner. We are committed to providing the highest level of security and privacy regarding the collection and use of our customers' personal information, as well as personal information of all consumers who visit our institution and website. As such, the Privacy Disclosure below will serve as NOLA Bank's Privacy Policy. This policy will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors on an annual basis.

FACTS	WHAT DOES NOLA BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?	
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.	
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: • Social Security number • Account balances • Transaction or loss history • Credit history • Overdraft history • Account transactions When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.	
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons NOLA Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

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What We Do	
How does NOLA Bank protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We also maintain other physical, electronic and procedural safeguards to protect this information and we limit access to information to those employees for whom access is appropriate.
How does NOLA Bank collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you: • Open an account • Pay your bills • Apply for a loan • Use your credit or debit card • Make deposits or withdrawals from your account We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only: • Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness • Affiliates from using your information to market to you • Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.
Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. • <i>NOLA Bank does not have any affiliates.</i>
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. • <i>NOLA Bank does not share with non-affiliates so that they can market to you.</i>
Joint Marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. • <i>NOLA Bank doesn't jointly market.</i>
